First, a reminder...SMOKE ALARM BEEPING? Unfortunately, I'On At Home CANNOT help once the beeping starts. Our services are provided by volunteers, and we are not on call 24/7/365, so we can't respond in an urgent situation. BUT the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department CAN help – call 843-849-2065, the direct line to Station #3, right down Mathis Ferry Road. Don't call 911 for smoke alarm battery help. If they are not out on a call, the firemen will change your smoke alarm battery. Leave a message if no one answers.

IAH **CAN** help you prevent needless beeping! Watch for your IAH newsletter in **January** when we offer our **annual smoke alarm battery change program**. All you have to do is sign up, buy the batteries, and our volunteers will come to your house and change them. If you do this each January, you should never have to worry about annoying and loud false alarms. Don't forget that if you need help to register for an IAH event or to request a service, you can always e-mail us at <u>ion@ionathome.org</u> or call us at 843-284-3690. Monday through Friday, from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM, and someone should get back to you promptly. At other times, the response may be during the next "office hours."
