September 10th 12:00PM - 1:00PM Private Tour of the Gibbes Museum's Japanese Print Collection with Arthur Richardson



The Gibbes Museum of Art is home to one of the most significant collections of Japanese woodblock prints in the Southeast.

Gibbes Museum guide Arthur Richardson has deep knowledge of the history of Japanese printmaking and is giving us a special private tour of this exhibit. The collection reflects the full range of popular print subjects by master <u>Ukiyo-e</u> artists of the <u>Edo</u> period, from famous Kabuki theater actors portrayed by Suzuki <u>Harunobu</u> and <u>Toshusai Sharaku</u> in the 18th century, to vibrant landscapes by <u>Utaguwa Hiroshige</u> and <u>Katsushika</u> Hokusai in the 19th century.

The tour will take about 45 minutes. You'll also be able to visit the companion exhibit: Japonisme in Charleston: Alice Smith and her Circle as well as the rest of the museum.

The Gibbes requires that everyone entering the museum wear a mask.
