HAPPY SUMMER, IAH MEMBERS AND FRIENDS!

Goodness, it's started with a strong, hot statement, hasn't it? Thanks goodness for AC!

This month I have several things that I want to share with you. First, we're so glad to see more requests for services from our Full Members. Keep those coming – think of things IAH volunteers can do to make your life more "carefree." Some important notes about entering those requests on our website:

- 1. Be sure you log in.
- 2. When you click on the "MEMBERS" tab at the top of the home screen, the first drop-down item is "New Service Request."
- 3. The next screen is where you enter the information about the kind of help you want. Please note that the default "SERVICE DATE" is the next

day. Be sure you change that to the date you actually want the service to happen (As a quick explanation, our system retains service requests until that service date passes. If you don't change the date, your request disappears 2 days from when you enter it). Give us as much notice as possible (at least 3 days) – the more time we have, the more likely we are to be able to meet your request.

HELP I'ON AT HOME WHEN YOU SHOP ONLINE

You can help in a couple of easy ways to support I'On At Home. As you know, we are a nonprofit organization, relying on memberships and donations to cover our operating costs. Many of you regularly make online purchases, either on Amazon or other websites. By taking a few simple steps, you can make sure that, each time you buy something, IAH receives a contribution.



iGive - FREE Membership. Great Deals

Create your free iGive account by clicking on the logo (IAH is listed as "I'On At Home"). After that, all

you need do is shop through the <u>iGive.com</u> website, newsletters, or install the optional iGive Button* to make sure you never miss an opportunity to raise money when you shop online. It's all automatic, and it's all free of charge. iGive lets you control your membership information with a private password. You can review your store visits and purchase/donation history, and confirm the total amount raised and distributed to your cause. iGive values your privacy and will never release shopper information without consent. And there are no hidden fees or extra costs when you shop through iGive. <u>In only six months</u> of this year, IAH has already receivedmore than \$135 from iGive!

You shop. Amazon gives. AmazonSmile, the AmazonSmile Foundation will donate 0.5% of the purchase price of eligible products to the charitable organization of your choice. You must first go to smile.amazon.com to register so that IAH can receive the matching contribution. You will place your Amazon order from this site. On your initial visit, it asks what charity you want to support. We are registered as "Ion at home.com." So far in 2018, we've received almost \$60 from AmazonSmile!

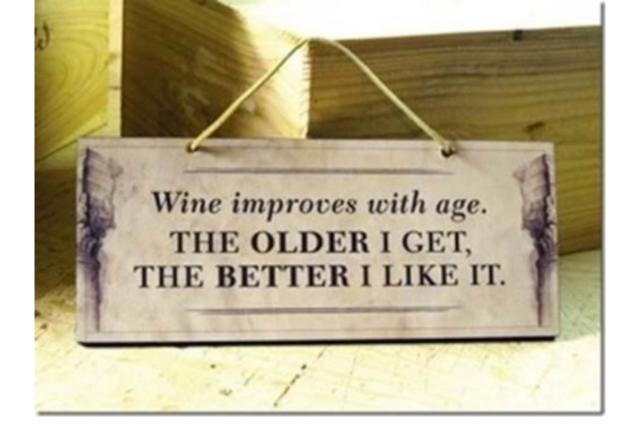
